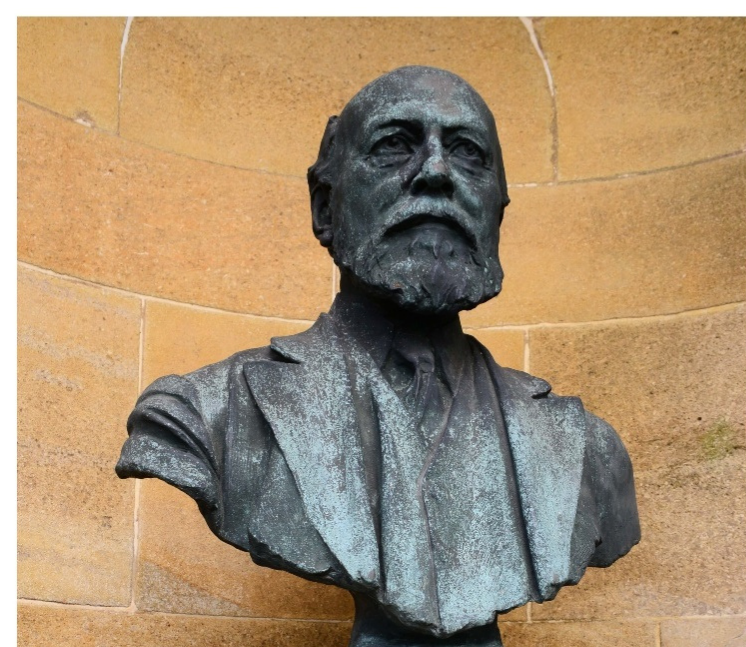

The Rest House Built in 1914 and now home to the Carillon Visitor Centre

Quaker Meeting House Built in 1905, a Y-shaped building designed by W.A. Harvey

St Francis Church Early Christian basilica style church, consecrated in 1925

St Lazar's Church An incredible Serbian Orthodox Church with a spectacular interior

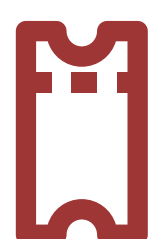
The War Memorial Room Situated in the Pavilion to remember Cadbury employees
