

Travelling to Stourbridge Quaker Meeting House Scotts Road, Stourbridge DY8 1UR

By car: Note that parking in Scotts Road outside the Meeting House is very limited and parking time is restricted to two hours. Please avoid bringing a car unless absolutely necessary. If you need to park near to the Meeting House access to Scotts Road is via A458 (Bridgnorth Road) and Forge Road. There are blue fingerposts to guide you from Forge Road. Some of the side streets before you reach the Meeting House have unrestricted parking. The Tesco car park opposite the Meeting House is limited to two hours, so may not be suitable. There is a small car park in Enville Street, between Forge Road and the ring road (see P on map below), but it is often full. There is a multi-story (pay and display) car park in the town centre which can be accessed by turning off the ring road immediately after the Police Station as if you were going to Aldi. Follow the road round past the Aldi car park entrance, bear left, and then on your right you will see the slope which is the entrance to the multi storey car park.

One option for people coming by car is to use the free parking at Stourbridge Junction station and take the shuttle train (platform 1) to the Stourbridge Town station (frequent, around 3 mins journey), and walk from there. The main car park at Stourbridge Junction station is often full during the week (see sign showing how many spaces left), but the overflow car park (access via Rufford Road, which is opposite the station entrance) has spaces. It is a fairly long walk from this car park to the station (but on pedestrian only paths).

By Bus: the number 9 from Birmingham will take you to Stourbridge Bus Station.

By train: from/via either Moor Street or Snow Hill Station to Stourbridge Junction, then take the shuttle to Stourbridge Town

To walk from the bus or town rail station (on the same site) you follow signs to the town centre using the underpass to cross the ring road. Walk down High Street through the shops until the road turns left. Carry straight on for a few meters on the pedestrianised area, then bear left on Crown Lane down the hill. This takes you to a pedestrian crossing on the ring road, with the Meeting House visible opposite.
